

Lino Gutiérrez retired from the Foreign Service in 2006 after a 29-year career. His assignments included the Dominican Republic, Haiti, Portugal, France, and the Bahamas. From 1996 to 1999, he served as U.S. Ambassador to Nicaragua. From 1999 to 2002, he was Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary and Acting Assistant Secretary of the Western Hemisphere affairs bureau. His last Foreign Service posting was as U.S. Ambassador to Argentina from 2003 to 2006. Mr. Gutierrez is the recipient of several awards, including the Distinguished Service Award. After retirement, Mr. Gutierrez served as Senior Advisor to the Secretary of Commerce, adjunct professor at Johns Hopkins and George Washington universities, instructor at the Foreign Service Institute, international consultant, and Executive Director of the Una Chapman Cox Foundation. He has also served in several boards, including the Institute for the Study of Diplomacy at Georgetown University.
