**ORDER: GRIEVANT'S MOTION TO DELAY SUBMISSION OF REVISED
DISCOVERY AND REQUEST FOR CLARIFICATION REGARDING
SUPPLEMENTAL SUBMISSION**

BACKGROUND

Grievant filed a Motion to Delay Submission of Revised Discovery and Request for Clarification Regarding Supplemental Submission, dated January 7, 2008. The motion applied to FSGB Case Nos. 2007-007, 008 and 009. These cases were consolidated by the Board on May 7, 2007 with the case number 2007-007. There is no pending order regarding FSGB Case No. 2007-007.

The Board is assuming that grievant is referring to her grievance in FSGB Case No. 2007-005 because she referenced the Annual Evaluation Form (AEF) guidelines in her motion. On December 17, 2007 the Board sent an Executive Secretary Memorandum that requested that grievant resubmit her Motion to Compel. A review of the record in Case No. 2007-005 indicated that grievant filed a Motion to Compel on May 12, 2007. The Agency does not object to the extension of time.

ORDER

Grievant's motion to extend the time to resubmit her Motion to Compel is granted.

Timeline And Due Dates

Motion to Compel

Grievant's Motion to Compel, if any, is due no later than February 1, 2008.

The Agency's opposition to the Motion to Compel, if any, is due no later than February 15, 2008.

Supplemental Submission

Grievant's supplemental submission is due no later than 30 days after all remaining discovery issues have been resolved. This will provide grievant with ample time to review the Agency's documentation and prepare her supplemental submission.

The Board may not advise grievant on matters to include in her supplemental submission. However, in its memorandum of December 17, 2007 the Board stated: "Grievant is requested in her supplemental submission to identify as fully as practicable the specific rules and procedures allegedly violated."

In all other respects, the motion is denied.
